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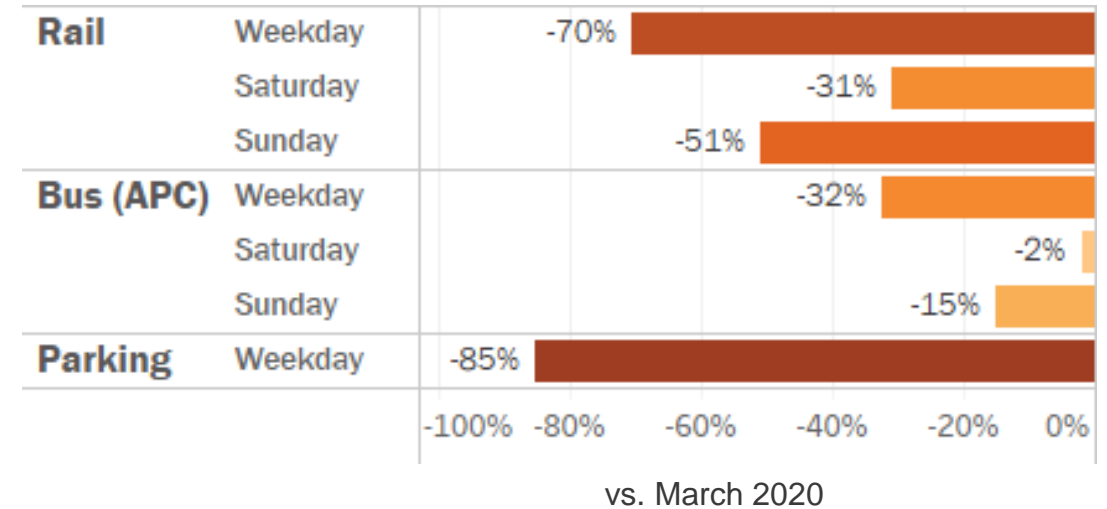

Overall Ridership in March

- **Comparison to March 2020, as pandemic began to impact ridership**
- **Rail**
 - Ridership 70% lower than 2020 on weekdays
- **Bus**
 - Ridership 32% lower than 2020 on weekdays
- **Parking**
 - Usage 85% lower than 2020

Bus and Rail: March 2020 vs. March 2021

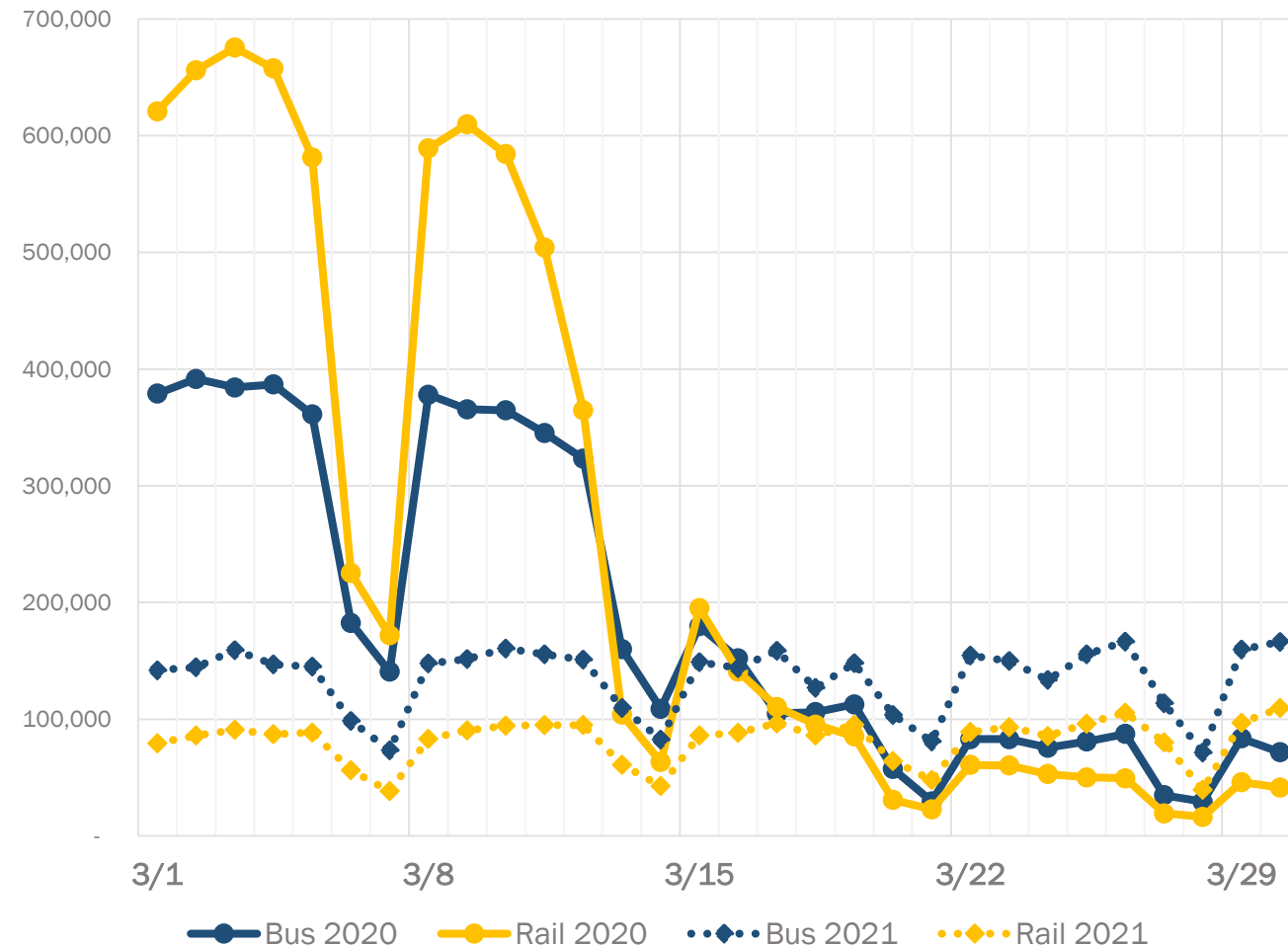
- **Use caution when comparing averages this month**

- First half of the month: 2020 much higher than 2021
- Second half of the month: 2020 very low ridership as severe impacts from COVID-19 began; 2021 higher than 2020

- **Now in March 2021:**

- Rail ridership rising steadily over the month to around 100,000 trips per weekday
- Bus ridership higher than rail, increasing gradually
- Bus weekend ridership appears similar to 2020 levels: two weekends below, two above

Ridership by Day, March 2021 vs. 2020

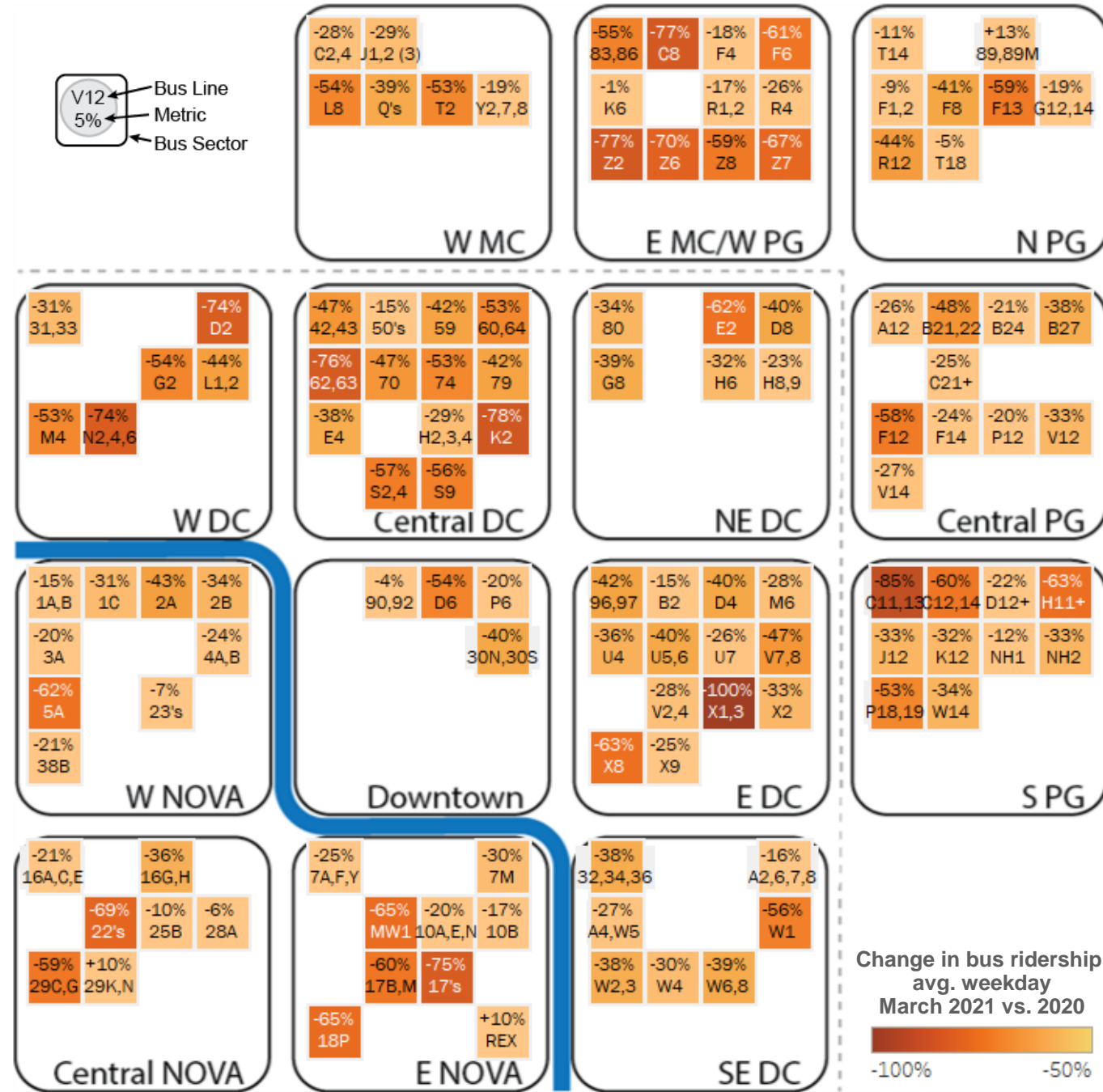
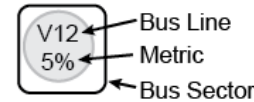


Metrobus Ridership

- Weekday ridership 70% lower than 2020 levels

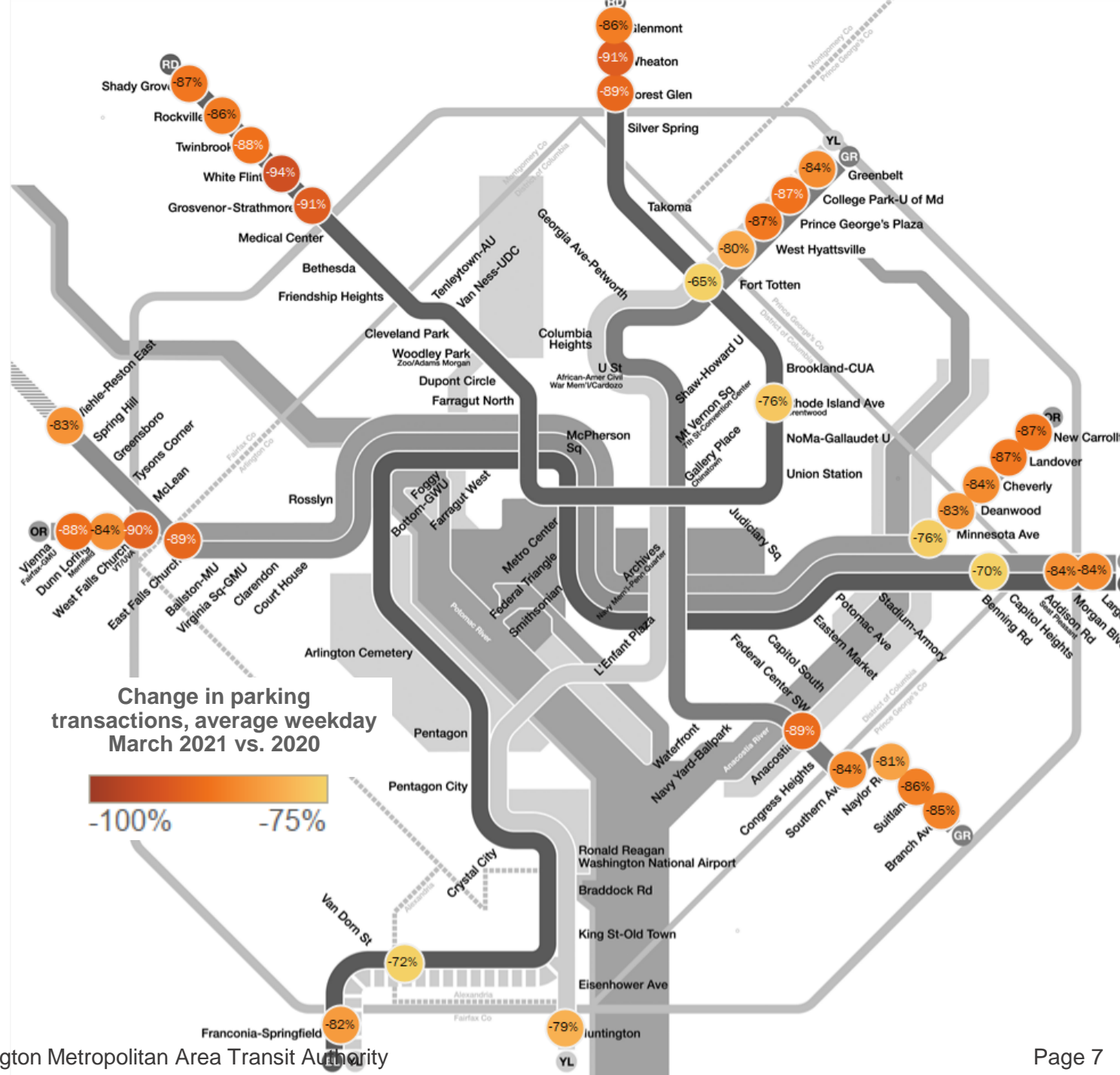
Notes:
