FFY 2009 Annual Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Goal

PURPOSE

The purpose of this action is to seek approval of the 45-day period for public comment regarding the proposed Annual Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program (DBE) Goal for Federal Fiscal Year 2009. This is in compliance with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) regulations for federally-funded recipients, which require a public comment period prior to final adoption of the annual goal.

DESCRIPTION

The U.S. Department of Transportation, under 49 CFR, Part 26, requires all recipients of federal funds to establish an annual goal for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation on federally funded contracts. WMATA will be informing the public of the proposed goal of 25% by holding a public comment period from May 30 through July 14, 2008. There will be a public meeting on July 14, 2008. The U.S. Department of Transportation has adopted a formula to calculate the annual goal. Staff utilized the formula and asked the U.S. Department of Transportation to review the formula and methodology prior to preparation of the proposed goal. The empirical data was generated from the 2002 U.S. Census data on businesses.

FUNDING IMPACT

The FTA requires an annual DBE goal as part of the certifications and assurances necessary to receive grant funding.


RECOMMENDATION

Purpose

To seek committee approval, as required by the Federal Transit Administration, to initiate a 45-day public comment period on the FFY 2009 annual DBE goal.

The proposed FFY 2009 Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Goal is 25%.



Benefit/Costs

The benefit: We will be in compliance with the required 45-day public comment period as mandated in 49 CFR Part 26.45.

The Costs: Minimal costs of advertisement.

Appendix A - Annual DBE Goal

Who must submit an annual DBE goal?

Any DOT recipient of federal funds per 49 CFR Part 26.

Why must we submit an annual DBE goal?

The FTA requires an annual DBE goal as part of the certifications and assurances necessary to receive grant funding.

Federal grant funding subjected to DBE regulations anticipated for FFY 09: \$253 million.

The annual DBE Goal is due to FTA on August 1, 2008.



Appendix A - Methodology

Formula Provided by U.S. Department of Transportation

Numerator = Ready, Willing and Able DBEs (Supplied by 2002 U.S. Census Data).

Denominator = Ready, Willing and Able Firms (Supplied by 2002 U.S. Census Data).

U.S. Census DBEs

Base Figure = U.S. Census Vendors



Appendix A - The FTA Goal Formula Process

Step 1 – Calculate the Base Figure.

Step 2 – Adjust Base Figure (Historical attainment).

Step 3 – Calculate Race Conscious/Race Neutral Percentage.

Race Conscious – A specific DBE goal is assigned to a contract.

Race Neutral – No DBE goal is assigned to a contract.



Appendix A - The FTA Goal Formula Findings

Race Conscious – 20.3%

More DBE vendors are winning WMATA contracts as prime contractors, which is why the Race Neutral percentage has increased.

The ultimate goal of the program is to move to a Race Neutral environment.
