### TITLE:

Public Hearing for Takoma Langley Crossroads T.C.

### PRESENTATION SUMMARY:

Board authorization for a Compact Public Hearing to consider adding the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center to WMATA's Adopted Regional System.

#### **PURPOSE:**

Board authorization for a Compact Public Hearing to consider adding the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center to WMATA's Adopted Regional System, as well as enter negotiations with Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) and execute an agreement regarding future operations and ownership of the transit center.

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

The Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center is nearly complete, with expected substantial completion Fall 2015, the facility is located in the triangle created by University Boulevard, New Hampshire Avenue and Lebanon Street. The transit center will serve six Metrobus routes (K6, K9, F8, C2, C4 and J4), and five Ride-On routes (15, 16, 17, 18 and 25). The bus route 18 and the University of Maryland shuttles will also use the transit center.

MTA managed the construction of the facility and will continue to own it; following completion the MTA anticipates operations responsibility to be transferred to WMATA under a lease and operating agreement.

To add the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center to the Adopted Regional System, an environmental evaluation of the proposed additions and a WMATA Compact Public Hearing must be held. A Categorical Exclusion (CE) has been approved in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to study the effects on the environment of building the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center. The CE will serve as the basis for an updated environmental evaluation for the WMATA Compact, which will be completed before the public hearing. Therefore, staff is seeking Board approval to hold the requisite Compact Public Hearing that would lead to adding the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center to the Adopted Regional System.

## **Key Highlights:**

The project is designed to provide several long-term public benefits, the most significant are:

- Provide a safe and convenient bus transfer station that will serve as a principal transfer location between Metrobus, Prince George's County's The Bus, Montgomery County's Ride-On, and the future Purple Line
- Improve pedestrian safety and access to transit service
- Protect and improve the lives of people in this community

## **Background and History:**

On June 20, 2005, the WMATA Board approved Resolution #2005-22, that allocated \$6,744,320 of WMATA TIIF to the State of Maryland for the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center. Subsequently, the State of Maryland was awarded a TIGER grant in 2009 providing additional funds allowing the project to advance to final design and construction. As originally conceived, MTA was to design, construct, operate and manage the transit center upon completion.

### Discussion:

This action only initiates the Compact Public Hearing process to amend the Adopted Regional System, allowing eventual acceptance of the transit center into the regional system under a lease and operating agreement. Concurrently, with the submission of the staff report supplement, staff will seek Board of Directors authorization for the General Manager/Chief Executive Officer (GM/CEO), or his designee, to negotiate and execute with the MTA an agreement governing future ownership and operational responsibility for the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center. Following approval of this action the next steps are as follows:

- July 2015 Conduct public hearing
- August 2015 Negotiate/execute an agreement for lease and operation of the facility with MTA
- September 2015 Obtain Board:
  - Approval of Public Hearing Staff Report
  - o Adoption of facility into WMATA's Adopted Regional System
  - Establisment of reimbursable project
- Fall 2015 Opening of Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center

### **FUNDING IMPACT:**

The costs associated with holding the public hearing are included in the existing FY2015 budget, so there is no immediate impact on funding. Should a future agreement on lease and operation of the facility be executed, approximately \$1.06 million would be required annually starting in FY2016 to operate and maintain the facility. These costs would be covered through a reimbursable project agreement with the State of Maryland.



# RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSIT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) has nearly completed construction of a transit center located at University Boulevard and New Hampshire Avenue in Prince George's County, Maryland (the "Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center"); and

WHEREAS, Metrobus provides service adjacent to the site of the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center on two priority corridor Metrobus lines; and

WHEREAS, Metrobus has a significant amount of transfer activity between Prince George's County's The Bus, and Montgomery County's RIDE-ON services at this location and moving this activity off-street will help improve pedestrian safety in the area; and

WHEREAS, The Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center is designed to fulfill WMATA's goals of delivering quality service to customers, and enhancing mobility by improving access to and linkages between transportation options; and

WHEREAS, The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) has previously committed \$6.7 million to the design of the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center through previous actions; and

WHEREAS, The intent of MTA is for WMATA to lease and operate the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center upon completion; and

WHEREAS, In order for WMATA to lease and operate the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center, the Transit Center would need to be added to the Adopted Regional System, for which the WMATA Compact requires a public hearing; now, therefore be it

*RESOLVED,* That, in accordance with Sections 13-15 of the WMATA Compact, the Board of Directors authorizes the conduct of a public hearing on the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center; and be it further

*RESOLVED,* That the General Manager/Chief Executive Officer (GM/CEO), in coordination with the Board of Directors, will establish the date, time and location of the hearing on the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors authorizes the GM/CEO to release the Public Hearing Staff Report regarding the Takoma Langley Crossroads Transit Center for public comment, as soon as the Staff Report is available, subject to later submission of the Staff Report Supplement, with final staff recommendations to the Board for its approval. All Board members will receive the Staff Report concurrently with its release for public review; and be it finally

*RESOLVED,* That this Resolution shall be effective 30 days after the adoption of this Resolution.
