

Platform Improvement Project

SUMMER 2019

Project overview

Metro's Platform Improvement Project will rebuild deteriorating platforms at 20 outdoor Metrorail stations over the next three years, making platforms safer and more accessible for all customers. To expedite construction and minimize inconvenience, Metro will close selected stations during construction and conduct as much work as possible during the summer months when ridership is lighter.

Metro's Capital Program

Metro is investing in system safety, reliability and the region's economy through its 10-year, \$15 billion capital program. For the first time in Metro's history, the capital program is bolstered by dedicated funding from Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia to improve the customer experience and keep the region's infrastructure in a state of good repair. The Platform Improvement Project is one of many initiatives funded by the capital program, along with efforts that invest in railcars, buses, stations, tracks, tunnels, bridges, signals, communications, facilities, and passenger information systems.

Summer 2019 station closures

The six **Blue** and **Yellow** line stations south of Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport will be closed from **Saturday, May 25 to September 8, 2019**.

No **Blue** or **Yellow** line service south of Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport during Summer 2019. The airport station will remain open with service operating to all points north.

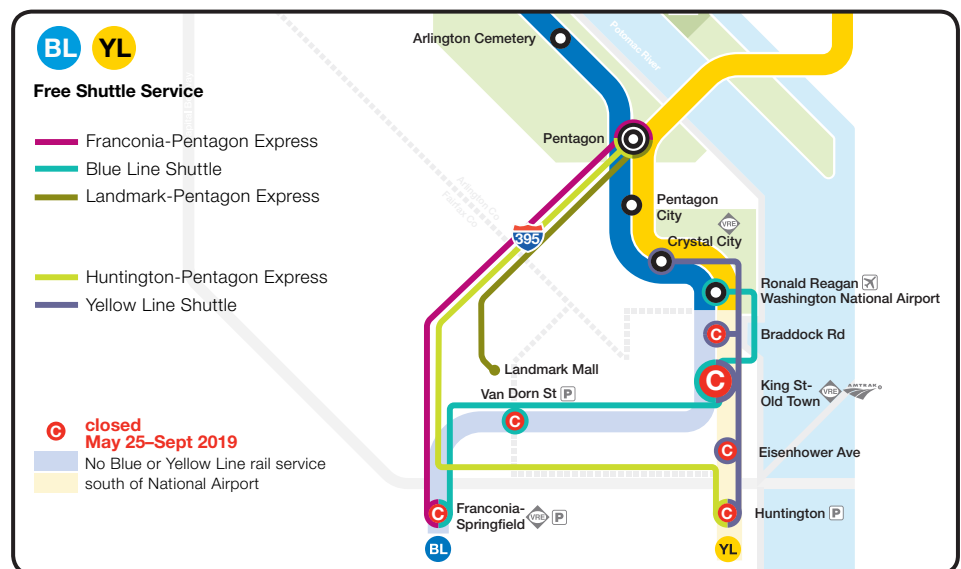
Travel alternatives
